COUNSELING OFFICE CORNER

- **November 5–6th:** Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) Review for current 9th graders. Counselors will go into classrooms and assist students in reviewing their four-year plans for high school. Counselors will present opportunities that open up to students and discuss graduation requirements.
- **November 7th:** ICAP Review for current 10th graders.
- **November 8th:** ICAP Review for current 11th graders.
- **November 13th:** ICAPs must be entered and fully completed in Infinite Campus.
- **November 21st:** ASVAB is administered to juniors (and some seniors) in the Aux Gym. Students need to bring fully charged Chromebooks to school that day. More information will be sent out in the next couple of weeks.
- **November 19th:** Chad Cargill ACT Workshop at Drury University- Register and pay by November 19th. Click on this [link](#) to register and find out more information.


